Background

- China and India share a 2,100-mile-long disputed border.
- Tensions along this border continued recently in the Tawang region and around the border area known as the de facto *Line of Actual Control* in the Northeast Indian state of Arunachal Pradesh, which China claims.
- The conflict dates back over 60 years, but the latest skirmishes are the most significant since 2020.
- Despite bilateral talks, clashes could lead to more substantive battle and escalated tension between these two nuclear powers and major trading partners.
