
Background

- Australia's Defense Department announced it will remove security cameras made by two Chinese firms from government buildings
- Over 900 Chinesemanufactured cameras have been installed at over 250 Australian government sites*
- In addition to national security concerns, Australian authorities point to Hikvision and Dahua's alleged involvement in human rights abuses and mass surveillance of Uyghurs in Xinjiang
- China called this measure an "abuse of state power to discriminate and suppress Chinese companies"**
