

Background

- Brazil elects new President, Luiz Inácio Lula da Silva, on 1/1/23.
- Election results were razor close in race vs incumbent Jair Bolsonaro.
- Bolsonaro questioned electoral integrity prior to the vote in anticipation of potential defeat.
- Following Bolsonaro's loss, supporters took to the streets to protest results, using vehicles to block traffic, and called for a coup.
- Activity included a violent group storming/ransacking Brazil National Congress and other official buildings.
