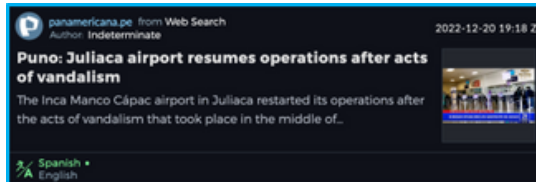

Background

- Peru marked by political protests since December 2022.
- Protests started following impeachment of President Pedro Castillo by Peruvian Congress.
- Castillo's supporters believe he was unjustly removed, and push for his reinstatement or new elections.
- Security forces have imposed a state of emergency, and conflict and deaths rise as these protests continue.
- Violence has continued into 2023 as new elections are being discussed.
- New elections would not get slated until later this year or in 2024, if they do happen at all.
