Background

- Thefts of catalytic converters off of cars are on the rise in the U.S.
- From 2018 to present, annual thefts have risen from around 1.300 to over 52,000.
- These thefts are being driven by both strong resale value as well as the value of precious metals found within the part itself.
- Experienced bad actors can remove this valuable part off a car within minutes.
- Replacement costs for the part can check in between \$1,000-\$3,000 for the victim.


