Background*

- Sep. 2022 report by Spain-based NGO
 Safeguard Defenders stated that Chinese police run 54 "service stations" in 30 countries across five continents under pretenses of providing Chinese nationals with services such as extending driver's licenses
- The investigation alleged that these police "service stations" are involved in "persuasion to return" operations against oversees Chinese residents (constituting illegal policing operations)
- Some countries ordered these stations to be shut down immediately; China has denied all accusations
